DESIGN FOR A BUTTON.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 13,176, dated August 15, 1882.

Application filed June 30, 1882. Term of patent 7 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN A. DEKNATEL, of Brooklyn, in the county of Kings and State of New York, have invented a new and useful Improvement in Designs for Buttons, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description

Reference is to be had to the accompanying drawing, forming a part of this specification, so in which my newly-designed button is shown.

The leading feature of my design consists in a bunch of flowers the stems of which are crossed by a curved or straight bar. The flowers and the curved bar are raised from the surface of the button and are above the leaves, which are between the flowers and are not raised as much from the surface of the button as the flowers are. I have shown three flowers; but this number can be raised without deviating from the leading feature of my design. The upper edge of the bar is serrated, and two side leaves project from the stems of the flowers below the curved bar; but they may be omitted. The surface of the bar may be ornamented by means of raised or recessed designs.

Having thus described my invention, I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

1. The herein-described design for buttons, consisting of leaves and flowers having the 30 stems crossed by a bar, as set forth.

2. The herein described design for buttons, consisting of raised flowers and raised leaves between them and of a bar crossing the stems of the flowers, as set forth.

3. The herein-described design for buttons, consisting of leaves and flowers having their stems crossed by a bar and of side leaves projecting from the stems below this bar, as set forth.

4. The herein-described design for buttons, consisting of leaves and flowers having the stems crossed by a curved bar having the upper edge serrated, as set forth.

5. The herein-described design for buttons, 45 consisting of leaves and flowers having the stems crossed by a curved bar having its surface ornamented, as set forth.
